

Tree Drawings and Size Ratings

Tree shape and growth habit change as a tree grows. Young trees are often upright, while older ones of the same cultivar may become spreading. "Mature" size of a tree varies by climate, landscape site characteristics and how long the tree lives. City trees rarely reach the size and age of their counterparts in native forest stands.

In a city situation, few trees live more than 30 years, and those that do generally grow slowly beyond that age. Therefore, the size ratings and growth habits shown in this catalog are our best estimates for a healthy 30 year old tree grown under "average" city conditions.

Our grading standards follow the system, developed by the American Nursery & Landscape Association (ANLA). Caliper measurements are taken at six inches above the bud union in budded trees, and at six inches above the ground in trees grown on their own root.

This is an excellent street tree selection from a species that has earned a reputation as a tough city tree.

Rootstocks for Crabapples

Our line of crabapples is now offered on four distinct apple understocks. Choose the best rootstock or combination of rootstocks to fit your growing system, soils and climate.

Domestic

This "old standard" rootstock still gives the best growth rate and produces a very uniform, deep root system. Roots go deep to find water in dry areas, and provide extremely good anchorage. Its main disadvantage is heavy suckering. It is also slightly less cold hardy.

Hardy Crabapple Seedling

Dolgo crabapple seed produces excellent rootstocks for the coldest areas. They produce well branched root systems, and the trees tend to be intermediate in growth and suckering between Domestic and EMLA 111. This is the rootstock to have in areas where temperatures drop to -30°F with no snow cover, In years of seed shortage, we may substitute different but equally hardy crab seedlings, such as Malus antonovka.

EMLA 111

Suckering is rare on this clonal rootstock developed for the apple industry. Proven on orchard soils around the world, its reduced suckering, improved cold hardiness, and broad soil adaptability are its claims to fame. A heavy flowering tree that matures to about 80 percent of the height of a tree grown on domestic rootstock is produced.

EMLA 26 - Dwarf

We have created a whole range of dwarf crabapples cultivars by budding many of our standard varieties on EMLA 26 rootstocks. The result is a line of dwarf trees that mature at about 40 percent of standard trees yet are well supported. Perfect for smaller lots, container use and patio gardening, these dwarf forms have low maintenance advantages that your customers will appreciate.


USDA Cold Hardiness Map

This map follows the USDA cold hardiness system, which is based on average minimum temperatures in each area and gives a guideline for plant adaptability.

Plant material in our catalog is rated with a USDA zone number, which is correct to the best of our knowledge. Zones can be divided further into "a"

or "b". When used, "a" refers to the colder half of the zone and "b" to the warmer half.

For example, Zone 4a indicates temperatures of -25° to -30° F. However, we cannot be responsible for hardiness since growing conditions, site selection and unusual winter weather will affect winter survival.




Approximate Range of Average Annual Minimum Temperatures for Each Zone



Linden, Honeylocust, Ash and Kentucky Coffee Tree will usually be completely free of branches. Some Crabapple, Oaks, and Norway Maple varieties often have a number of branches while others do not. Elms, Red Maples and to a lesser extent Sugar Maples tend to branch freely off one-year growth. Branches that develop on whips are left to help increase caliper and thus provide a sturdier stem.



Branched Flowering Trees

Hawthorns, Flowering Crabapples and Cherries are generally 2 year old trees topped at 4 to 5 feet, depending on cultivar. A leader is reestablished by taping. Flowering Pear and Mountain Ash have a dominant central leader and branch well naturally, so are generally untopped. Head height, symmetrical branching and straight central leader create a structural foundation for a premium quality caliper



tree for the grower, while the heavy branch structure and full canopy serve the needs of the garden center.


Branched Shade Trees

Varieties including Ash, Birch, Honeylocust, Linden, Oak, and some Maple are produced with a straight central leader and radiating lateral branches. Varieties which are not free branching, such as Norway Maple, Sugar Maple and Honeylocust, are topped while dormant to promote symmetrical branching during the next growing season. A single dominant straight leader is then established by hand taping the top shoot. Varieties that branch well are not topped. In either case, the resulting tree has a straight leader and symmetrical branching. In general, 6 - 8' and 1" - 11/4" grade trees are two years old. Most larger sizes are three years old, possessing fuller heads and more secondary branching.



Light Branched Trees

These have the same general form as branched trees. They differ in having fewer and/or shorter branches. They are often a good, economical choice for growers who are lining out trees, as they have good sturdiness due to their caliper, while the heads are lighter and will be less likely to lean or fall over in strong winds. Growers generally thin out and prune back branches when planting, so this tree can work well for




them. Garden centers and landscapers may not be happy with light branched trees as they don't have the time to let the tree fill out.

Weeping Trees

Weeping forms of Flowering Cherry, Crabapple, Mulberry, Siberian Peashrub and others are graded by head quality. Certain compact or dwarf forms of Crabapple, Ash, Linden, Locust and others are grown as


top grafts, which are also graded by head quality. Heavy Select and Number 1 grades should be used for landscape installations and quality garden center sales. Number 1 light and Number 2 grades are lighter and less full, and therefore offered at a lower price. They are good for growers who line out stock for several years.



Weeping Number 1 head, 6 ft.


Contorted Trees

Contorted trees are trained from their first flush of growth as whips to develop a contorted, snaking trunk. Graded by head quality, the caliper of these trees is equivalent to straight trunked trees of the same grade and variety, but with a shorter overall height due to their curved trunks. As is the case with weeping trees, heavy select and Number 1 grades are best for landscape installation and garden center sales. Number 1 light and Number 2 grades are a less expensive alternative for growers who line them out for several years.




Balled & Burlapped Trees

B&B trees are appropriate for lining out in the field, landscape installation, immediate garden center sales, or containerizing for future sale. Our B&B line complements bare root production by offering balled and burlapped trees of varieties that are difficult to handle bare root. Some varieties are offered B&B as well as bare root so growers can choose the type of liner that works best for them. Trees are carefully dug by hand by our own crews.



Multiple Stemmed Forms

A variety of plants are grown with multiple stems. If several separate root stocks are combined, we consider the plant a clump. Paper and European Birch are produced this way. Bushes and multi-stem trees are produced by stubbing a single understock just above ground level, and encouraging several stems to grow. If the plant matures to less than 15 feet, we classify it as a bush. If it normally grows to tree-sized proportions we call it multi-stem.



Multi-stemmed 6 ft.



These are smaller sized one year old trees. Far from being the "runts of the litter" of our regular production, these trees are grown apart from the rest of the crop, using special techniques to produce high

quality little trees at a lower cost.

These are excellent small liners for hot climates where larger trees are more subject to transplant shock. They are excellent promotional items for garden centers, allowing advertising of name brand cultivars at low prices. And they are of ideal size for mail order distribution.

Most cultivars are unbranched or lightly branched and sold as a whip grade. Plums are branched and listed as such.




Custom 3™ 5 ft., branched

Custom 5®

The perfect tree for the retail garden center! This is a small branched tree which is produced by using a variety of special cultural techniques. The tree is designed to fit neatly in a #5 container. The tree size and branch structure are exactly proportioned to this pot size.

All shade tree varieties are produced with a straight leader so that the tree will continue to grow upright, and lower limbs may be removed. Most flowering trees are topped to produce a gracefully spreading canopy.



As there is little standardization among container manufacturers, we recommend a pot with a top diameter of 13 inches and an 11 inch depth. This is a little wider than many producers' #5 container.


Custom Liner®

These trees are produced especially for growers who are concerned about the quick establishment and survival of their trees.

Custom Liner® trees are root pruned, a practice

which results in a denser, more fibrous root system and less transplant shock. The branches are considerably shorter than our standard grade. This means they will need very little pruning before planting out. Thus the terminal buds can be left intact on the leader and branches, and straighter regrowth may result.

We train Custom Liner® trees to develop a good branch structure in the 5 to 7 foot area of the trunk. This is the area that is most important to growers in establishing the base of the tree's canopy structure.





Custom 10[®]

A step larger in size than Custom 5[®], these two year old trees are grown to create maximum appeal in the retail sales yard. Averaging 1" in caliper, Custom 10® trees give an immediate impact to the landscape. Branching near 32" in flowering trees, and just above 40" in most shade tree varieties puts the fullest part of the canopy at eye level where customers are better able to appreciate their fullness.

Trees are grown to be exactly the right size and proportion for

potting into a #10 container. Root systems will fit the pot with little trimming. We recommend a #10 container with 13 to 15 inch depth and a 15 to 16 inch top diameter. Pots shorter than 13 inches will not have enough depth to accommodate the roots of certain varieties.



Shrubs

Hardy deciduous shrubs complement our tree product line. Approximately two dozen species are available in containers from year to year. A variety of cultivars are offered within each species. These include but are not limited to: Barberry, Dogwood, Cotoneaster, Smokebush, Euonymus, Fothergilla, Forsythia, Hibiscus, Hydrangea, St. Johnswort, Mockorange, Ninebark, Potentilla, Cistena Plum, Fernleaf Buckthorn, Sumac, Willow, Spiraea, Snowberry, Lilac, Witch Hazel and Weigela. Their availability throughout the year is published in our stock available lists.

Our tree product line includes deciduous shrubs that lend themselves to being grown as small trees. By top grafting or developing a canopy atop an own-root standard, we offer a line of small-scale trees that are ideally suited for container culture and small-space gardening. Dwarf Forsythia, Contoneaster, Smoketree, Dwarf Korean Lilac, Japanese and Chinese Tree Lilacs, and Dappled Willow are among the tree-like shrubs described in our Reference Guide.

CustomValue® trees are made to order for garden center retailers who wish to offer value-priced trees without compromising quality. Their competitive retail price and convenient size create a very attractive product for gardeners on a budget.

Growers who prefer to plant in the fall or during other times when bare root trees are unavailable are finding CustomValue® trees to be excellent field liners or for shifting up into larger containers.

Regardless of intended use, the varieties and cultivars we offer represent a nice cross-section of shade

Grown in #5 containers, CustomValue® trees are pruned and trained through the season to assure good form and branching. Each is supported by a bamboo stake. They average four to six feet in height, depending on the variety.

VigorLiner°

The VigorLiner® series is a collection of high value deciduous trees grown in containers. Most are not widely available due to difficulty in bare root handling and transplanting. These container-grown liners are ideal for those who prefer to plant in the fall or at other times of year to suit individual production schedules. They are also suitable for garden center sales.

Gowers find VigorLiner® trees to be an economical and viable size for lining out and growing to landscape specimen size. Those in #2 and #3 containers range in size from four to six feet in height, depending on variety.

Due to customer requests for a huskier liner, we grow some varieties in #5 containers for an additional year. Growers who want to line out a larger tree for faster turnaround will appreciate their greater root mass and caliper.


Various growing regimens are used to encourage the development of fibrous root systems and to eliminate the growth of circling roots. The resulting trees have better branched root systems with a greater number of growing root tips that, upon transplanting, will reach out into the soil and help to establish roots more quickly

Containerized Trees

Our containerized shade and flowering trees are a much different product than traditional "container-grown" trees. Comparing the two is an "apples and oranges" affair. Generously graded by height and caliper as well as container size, trees are generally larger than those sold by container size alone. Unlike many "container-grown" trees, our containerized trees have strong, straight trunks with heavy caliper in relation to height.

By "containerized," we mean that most of our trees are field grown to nearly finished size, then established in containers for year-round sales. During their years in the field, special cultural techniques including pruning, transplanting and undercutting help to tailor a tree ideal for finishing in containers. They possess balanced, welldeveloped root systems that quickly establish themselves first in the container, and then in the landscape.

Containerized in early spring, trees receive intensive care including careful pruning, fertilization and optimal irrigation throughout the growing season. Under properly controlled growing conditions which we have perfected over the years, they add considerable branch length, leaf density and caliper size while growing in containers. Because we pioneered containerization of field grown trees, you can depend on us to provide the best in the business. Eliminate the springtime headaches of potting your own. Let us do the work of growing premium trees and shrubs so you can concentrate on selling them.




